Introduction

The Labor Commuting Report for the Moberly Area aims to assist in addressing the evolving development and workforce requirements of local employers, entrepreneurs, and other stakeholders. The primary focus areas of this report include Howard and Randolph County, Missouri, shedding light on the origins, destinations, and characteristics of the workforce residing and employed in the region.

This study delves into measuring and quantifying workforce availability within the laborshed, which is defined as the area or region from which an employment center draws its commuting workers, showing the distribution of these workers regardless of political boundaries.

This report draws upon data sourced from major employers in the area and reputable outlets such as the U.S. Census Bureau, the Center for Economic Studies, and the Missouri Economic Research and Information Center. By synthesizing this information, the study aims to provide a better understanding of the local workforce's dynamics, fostering informed decision-making for stakeholders invested in the economic vitality of the Moberly Area. The overarching goal is to empower the community by leveraging its workforce potential for sustained economic growth and development.



Howard County, Missouri

Howard County was established under an act of the general assembly, approved on January 13, 1816, and was named in honor of Benjamin Howard, the inaugural governor of the Missouri Territory.

Situated along the Missouri River, Howard County was predominantly settled by southerners, earning the region the moniker "Little Dixie." It became the heart of this cultural enclave, preserving its distinct traditions.

Strategically located for business, Howard County is positioned within two "truck days" of ninety percent of the United States, ensuring that semi shipments are just two days away from the majority of customers.

The town of Fayette is conveniently located two hours from Kansas City, while a drive to St. Louis takes only two and a half hours. Howard County is served by six major highways: U.S. Route 40, Route 3, Route 5, Route 87, Route 124, and Route 240.

Boasting a diverse economic landscape, Howard County sees contributions from various industries, including agriculture, manufacturing, healthcare, and services. Agriculture remains a cornerstone of the county's economy, emphasizing crop production and livestock farming.

As Moberly thrives on its historical legacy and strategic location, it continues to be a dynamic hub, fostering economic growth and development in the heart of Missouri.










Howard County Inflow/Outflow Analysis




Among the 12 reporting employers included in the zip code survey, a total of 1,025 employees work in Howard and Randolph Counties. Specifically, 235 employees are accounted for in Howard County, and 790 employees work in Randolph County.

Top 5

The top five towns from which workers commute to work in the MAEDC Region are Moberly, Glasgow, Huntsville, Macon, and Madison, Missouri. Specifically for Howard County, the leading towns in terms of worker commuting are Glasgow, Fayette, Marshall, Slater, and Armstrong. In Randolph County, the top five towns for worker commutes include Moberly, Huntsville, Macon, Madison, and Cairo.
